

PRESIDENTIAL AND FEDERAL ELECTION RESULTS



The 2016 election will be pored over by political scientists and historians alike. Two candidates with high disapproval ratings, a crowded primary field on one side, a call for a progressive revolution on the other side, a vacancy in the Supreme Court, and headlines that would make for a great season on House of Cards. Now that the dust has settled, Donald J. Trump will be the 45th President of the United States and the Republicans have maintained their control of both the House and the Senate.

State Results

Going into Election Day, Republicans made up a historically large 31-18 majority of governors. (There's one independent, Alaska's Bill Walker.) Of the 12 gubernatorial races on Tuesday, Republicans won six and Democrats won six. Democrats went into this election controlling the governorship, Senate and House in just seven states -- that was their lowest number since the Civil War, when there were 15 fewer states. Now, they control just five states. The GOP successfully defended its majorities in most chambers and also picked up chambers in Kentucky and Iowa, giving the party full control of those states.

What does it mean for NATSAP Members?



President-elect Donald Trump ran on a campaign pledge to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act. Since his election, however, he has expressed willingness to keep parts of the health reform law. What he will actually do is unpredictable, much like him. A concern for many NATSAP members is mental health parity and the effect that removing that language from current law would have on their program. Trump has the following plan regarding mental health on his website:

“We need to reform our mental health programs and institutions in this country. Families, without the ability to

get the information needed to help those who are ailing, are too often not given the tools to help their loved ones. There are promising reforms being developed in Congress that should receive bi-partisan support.”

The next edition of the Youth Advocate will focus on Trump’s State of the Union speech and a summary of his policy proposals and their effect on NATSAP members will be released then.

A BACKGROUND ON MENTAL HEALTH PARITY

President Kennedy first advocated for parity in mental health care coverage for employees of the federal government back in 1963. In 1999, President Clinton ensured parity in the Federal Employee Health Benefit Program and signed the Mental Health Parity Act in 1996 requiring comparable annual and lifetime dollar limits on mental health and medical coverage in large group employer-sponsored plans. The Paul Wellstone and Pete Domenici Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act (MHPAEA) of 2008 expanded parity protections to ensure that financial requirements and treatment limitations for mental health or substance use disorder benefits are generally no more restrictive than the limits applied to medical/surgical benefits. The Affordable Care Act further extended Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Parity protections to individual health insurance plans, and regulations implementing the Affordable Care Act’s

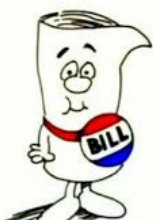
“essential health benefits” requirements extended parity protections to small group coverage. Recently, the Obama Administration finalized mental health and substance use disorder parity regulations for plans in the Medicaid and Children’s Health Insurance Programs.



But the National Alliance on Mental Illness says evidence from its own national survey shows insurance companies deny authorization for mental health care at more than double the rate of general medical care. Insurance companies use their own standards for what constitutes a medical necessity and are not forthcoming about informing patients of their standards.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE LAME DUCK SESSION

Mental Health legislation is expected to finally pass Congress. Portions of H.R. 2646 (sponsored by Representative Tim Murphy R-PA) were placed into a package bill (21st Century Cures Act), which had already passed both chambers, enabling lawmakers to expedite consideration of the legislation. H.R. 2646 had previously passed the House after being heavily amended in the House Energy and Commerce Committee. The portions of H.R. 2646 which will be included in the package bill establishes a new assistant secretary for mental health in the Department of Health and Human Services as well as a chief medical officer. The law would provide \$1 billion in state grants over two years to address opioid abuse and addiction. While most of that money would go to treatment facilities, some would fund research. The Cures Act would also boost funding for mental health research and treatment, with hundreds of millions of dollars authorized for dozens of existing and new programs.



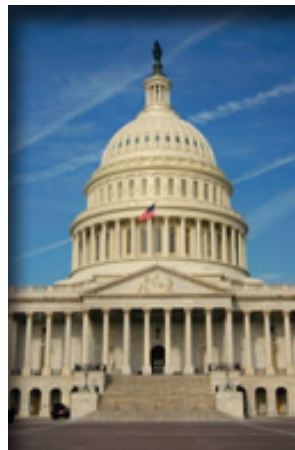
THE LATEST ON THE OVERTIME RULE

In our last edition of the Youth Advocate, we posted an article discussing the Department of Labor's new Overtime Rule, which would have raised the income ceiling to allow more people to be eligible for overtime. A federal judge has issued a preliminary injunction blocking the change, just days before it would have been implemented. The injunction is not final as the District Court has not made their final ruling. The Department of Labor has the option to appeal the ruling and ask for a stay of the injunction, which would result in the rules being implemented pending the appeal. With Republicans controlling both chambers of Congress and the Trump administration set to take office in January, the new overtime rule's long-term future remains uncertain.

THE 115TH UNITED STATES CONGRESS

The One Hundred Fifteenth United States Congress is the next meeting of the legislative branch of the United States federal government. It is scheduled to meet from January 3, 2017 to January 3, 2019, during what is slated to be the first two years of Donald Trump's presidency. The House and Senate Steering Committees are making changes to the leadership and members of the committees for the 115th session. As of December 2nd, the House Republican Steering Committee has selected Rep. Virginia Foxx (R-NC) as the chairwoman of the House Committee on Education and the Workforce in the 115th Congress.
